### **Isaiah's Ancient Song for Today: The Servant Suffers for Straying Sheep**

We will explore Isaiah's Ancient song for today. Words collapse before the enormity of Isaiah's Fourth Servant Song. The text takes us on a journey beginning with Christ's eternal relationship with his Father (Is 52:13), through the events of Holy Week (Is 52:14-53:10), and toward the message of the empty tomb on Easter (Is 53:11-12). Commenting on this powerful section of Isaiah, Martin Luther writes, *"This is the foremost passage on the suffering and resurrection of Christ, and there is hardly another like it. Therefore we must memorize this passage."*

This five-part study considers the song's context within Isaiah 40-55 and how it impacted New Testament authors like Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, and Paul. The discussion also takes up the how the Suffering Servant gives His gifts of peace and righteousness as well as what all of this means for Christians today.

Professors Jeff Gibbs and Reed Lessing will be our teachers for this study.

**BE THE CHURCH 2021**

Thank you for your support of BE THE CHURCH Local Mission Week 2021. Because of your generosity and participation we were able to serve people in our church, our community, and beyond. Check out everything that was accomplished during Mission Week 2021:

- 85 People of all ages participated in Mission Week
- 18 Youth served wholeheartedly and made new friends. Countless adults worked along side youth and children building relationships. There was a focus on Being The Church in Community, Prayer, Service, and Hope.
- 26 people on 4 teams built 14 beds with Sleep In Heavenly Peace for children sleeping on the floor in Kankakee County
- 20 1/2 complete bed sets were donated to Sleep In Heavenly Peace
- 22 tied fleece blankets were made for Phil's Friends, an organization that sends care packages to people going through cancer treatment
- 85 witness bracelets were made to be handed out by our members at the Kankakee County Fair at the St. Paul's Fair Booth
- 95 pencil pouches were packed and will be handed out at the Kankakee Farmer's Market by the St. Paul's School Board later this summer
- 20 Children's Bad Day Boxes, suicide

prevention care packages, were lovingly prepared for Project Headspace and Timing

- 97 pots were painted and planted, then given to St. Paul's Shut-ins or donated to local nursing homes or given to Bourbonnais Police and Fire Departments
- 180 Cards were colored and given a hand written message.
- Many tissue paper flowers and homemade gifts were created for our Shut-in visits.
- Many hours were spent doing landscaping at the Pregnancy Resource Center, the Downtown Church, the School, and a member's home. Trees and bushes were trimmed and lots of weeding was done.
- Many hours of cleaning were also done at the Pregnancy Resource Center, the Downtown Church, the School, and a member's home. Windows were washed, lunch room chairs and long white tables were power washed, the school library and classroom libraries were dusted, the downtown church was dusted and cleaned as well.

There were fun times too with a Photo Scavenger Hunt, many Bags games, and a Youth Lock-in.

We look forward to doing Mission Week again in 2022!
