NEXT VOTER'S MEETING

The next regular Voters' Meeting will be **January 23rd at 12:30 pm** at the Bourbonnais campus. Among the items to be considered are:

- * the announcement of the 2022 nominating committee
- * the planning retreat report
- * an update of the 2022 housing allowance

Members of the congregation who are age 18 or older are eligible to become voting members and to participate in the decision-making of the congregation. ***You are eligible to vote only after attending at least two Voters' meetings in a one-year time period. Even if you have never attended a voter's meeting and are not eligible to vote at this meeting, please consider attending so that you are eligible to vote on the next principal call.*** Voting membership privileges continue as long as you remain a member.

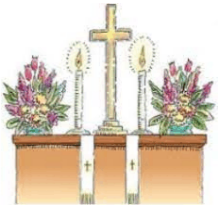
